Alcohol: #1 Drug of Choice among Youth

Alcohol is the number one drug of choice among youth. According to the 2017 Youth Risk Behavior Survey, in the past 30 days:

- 30% of high school students drank some amount of alcohol
- 14% of high school students binge drank
- 6% of high school students drove after drinking alcohol
- 17% of high school students rode with someone who had been drinking alcohol

Standard U.S. Drink Size

Only having one drink? A standard drink is equal to 14.0 grams (0.6 ounces) of pure alcohol. Generally, this amount of pure alcohol is found in

- 12 ounces of beer (5% alcohol content)
- 8 ounces of malt liquor (7% alcohol content)
- 5 ounces of wine (12% alcohol content)
- 1.5 ounces or a "shot" of 80-proof (40% alcohol content) distilled spirits or liquor (e.g., gin, rum, vodka, whiskey)

How Do I Know if I Have a Drinking Problem?

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), drinking is a problem if it causes trouble in your relationships, in school, in social activities or in how you think and feel. If you are concerned that either you or someone in your family might have a drinking problem, consult your personal health care provider or contact HC DrugFree for a list of providers.

Is Beer or Wine Safer to Drink than Liquor?

No. One 12-ounce beer has about the same amount of alcohol as one 5-ounce glass of wine or 1.5-ounce shot of liquor. It is the amount of alcohol consumed that affects a person most, not the type of alcoholic drink.
