- 2 recognize the signs and symptoms of overdose
- 3 perform rescue breathing
- **give** intra-nasal naloxone, a medication that reverses the effects of an overdose by re-storing the person's ability to breathe
- 5 care for the individual until help arrives.

In short, you'll acquire the skills, confidence and official certification you need to take life-saving action in an emergency.
