Howard County Overdoses: 2 Suspected Deaths And 2 Nonfatal

Last week, Howard County Police and Fire & Rescue Services responded to two suspected overdose deaths and two nonfatal overdoses. The overdoses occurred in West Friendship, Columbia, and Elkridge. The 2019 year-to-date overdose count is 21 fatal (16 confirmed opioid-related) and 128 nonfatal, for a total of 149.

Free Parenting Classes

HC DrugFree and the Howard County State's Attorney's Office in partnership with the Howard County Public School System and the Howard County Health Department will once again provide evidence-based classes for parents of 9 to 14 year olds to gain skills and knowledge to reduce the risk that their children will use drugs.


Remove Unwanted/Expired Medication And Sharps From Our Community
