## New Update: Drive-thru Medication and Sharps Collection

The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has announced that it plans to move forward with a national Drug Take Back Day on Saturday, October 24 between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. However, at this time, HC DrugFree's October 24 drive-thru prescription and over-the-counter medication and sharps (needles, syringes and EpiPens) collection is "tentative" until we receive COVID-19 guidance and confirm with our partners. #### Today at 5:30 PM: Learn to Save a Life

High school and middle school students, parents, babysitters, grandparents and everyone wanting to save the lives of loved ones are encouraged to join HC DrugFree's Teen Advisory Council (TAC) for a free online cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training this Monday, August 10 at 5:30 p.m.

Why should you know CPR? ...because 88% of all cardiac arrests occur at home or at work, so the chances of you knowing the person are very high. Yet, less than 1/3 of those who suffer cardiac arrest at home, work, or in a public place receive CPR. As a result, 400,000 people die each year in the U.S. Often, it's because loved ones or bystanders don't know CPR. When a person goes into Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA), his or her survival depends on immediately getting CPR. The Howard County Department of Fire and Rescue Services will conduct this training focused on saving infants, children and adults. Invite your family, friends, and co-workers to join us.
