


Registration Now Open! FREE Parenting Classes.

Parents Report Teens Face New or Worse Mental Health Issues

A recent poll conducted by Ipsos for C.S. Mott Children's Hospital at the University of Michigan Medical School, looked at how parents of children ages 13 to 18 were helping teens cope and where the parents believed their strategies were successful. The pandemic has disrupted teens' lives and seems to be causing higher levels of depression in teen girls than boys. For teen girls, 31% experienced depression compared to 18% of teen boys and 36% of teen girls faced anxiety compared to 19% of teen boys.
