14.67 Million Pounds of Medication Destroyed

While **1,494.5 lbs.** of unwanted and expired medication (not including sharps) were collected at HC DrugFree's drive-thru site on April 24, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) collected **839,543 pounds (419.7 tons)** of medications across the country on that same day.

Once again, families and individuals across Howard County and the U.S. showed their dedication toward preventing addiction and potential overdose by removing prescription pills from their homes.

"DEA's biannual Take Back Day events are critical to helping reduce overdose deaths and alleviate addiction by safely disposing of prescription medications that sit idle in the home," said DEA Acting Administrator D. Christopher Evans. "DEA is committed to providing a safe and secure method for the public to ride their homes of potentially dangerous drugs."

The DEA, along with its partners has now collected **14,670,240 pounds** of medications since the inception of the national prescription Drug Take Back initiative in 2010. HC DrugFree began holding collections in **2012** and only missed in Spring 2020 when the pandemic cancelled the national event.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month

HC DrugFree stands with our many partners this month and throughout the year as we work to end stigma, educate the community about mental health, and support individuals and their families. According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI):

- 1 in 5 U.S. adults experience mental illness each year, but less than half receive treatment.
- 1 in 6 U.S. youth experience a mental health condition each year, but

- only half receive treatment.
- 50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14 and 75% by age 24.
- Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among people 10-34.
