Safe Schools Maryland

Safe Schools Maryland is an anonymous and FREE reporting system available to students, teachers, staff members, parents, and the general public to report any school or student safety concerns, including mental health concerns. Safe Schools Maryland is Maryland's only official anonymous reporting system. Safe Schools Maryland operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a



year. Your anonymous report can be submitted by calling the tip line (1-833-MD-B-SAFE / 1-833-632-7233), completing an online form or downloading the free Safe Schools Maryland app from the App Store or Google Play.

All students should feel comfortable in Maryland's schools. Children and young adults are stronger students when they feel safe and secure. Strong students go on to serve as the foundation for strong communities.



Stop for the School Bus



The Maryland Center for School Safety (MCSS) wants you to know:

In a typical school year, more than 600,000 Maryland students ride school buses; however, many drivers are out of practice interacting with buses on our streets. Drivers need to be aware of children entering, exiting, or riding in a school bus and maintain a safe distance at all times.

Always prioritize safety first when approaching a school bus.

- Pay attention: especially in school zones and near school bus stops where children may be crossing the street
- Stop for the bus: because passing a school bus is illegal when its red lights are flashing and its stop-arm is extended while stopped to load or unload students; and
- Report it: when you see someone pass a stopped school bus.


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
