

Cannabis and Driving Don't Mix

Does consuming cannabis impair my driving?

Yes, driving after using cannabis affects your ability to drive safely, resulting in:

- Slower reaction time and reduced awareness of time and distance.
- Decreased ability to concentrate and make decisions.
- Difficulty staying in your lane.

Can I be arrested for driving under the influence (DUI) of cannabis?

Yes, if you are impaired while driving, even as a medical cardholder, you can be arrested for a DUI citation.

- Law enforcement officers can make a cannabis DUI arrest if they observe impairment using a standard field sobriety test (roadside test).
- It may not be easy to recognize when you are impaired. Effects of cannabis may also be delayed.
- You should wait at least 6 hours after using cannabis to drive.*



Keep Maryland safe. Make a plan before you consume cannabis.
